LIUTENANT GOVERNOR DONNA HILL SHARES HER VISION FOR THE DIVISION



Division 37 Lieutenant Governor Donna Hill joined us this week to share her Vision for the Division and share her passion for Kiwanis. Although our crowd was small this week, Donna inspired us all to move forward in our membership efforts.

Donna said that **Governor Roy Tally** has been a Kiwanian for 18 years and in that time he has built 80 clubs and brought in 120 members! **Now that's PASSION!** He wants to see the CAL-NEV-HA District be at 18,000 members

by the end of the club year (Sept. 30). It is currently 16,000. The goal for each club is to increase membership by 15% during the year. His motto, **"The Hands of Kiwanis Service"**, brings to mind the reason that we all joined Kiwanis... hands-on community service! **Donna's motto is "Passion, Growth, Service"** because she says you cannot do anything without passion! **Donna** said that she feels that you need to add passion to get growth and service and thus her heart symbol. 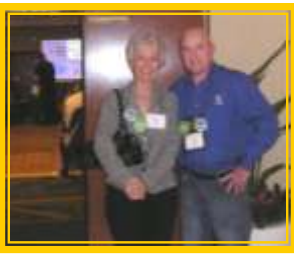

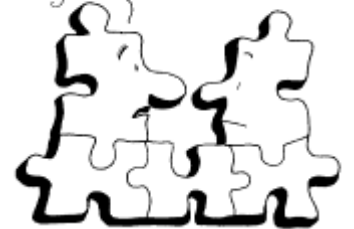


So can you see what's wrong?
